This is what Pope Francis underlined on the occasion of the Jubilee of Mercy: "Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instils in us the courage to look to the future with hope." The 4<sup>th</sup> annual **New Evangelization Summit**:

On Friday, April 27<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 - 9:30pm and Saturday, April 28<sup>th</sup> from 8:45am - 4:30pm the New Evangelization Summit will be livestreamed from Ottawa to Sudbury at **St. Benedict C.S.S.** The move from St. Charles College (last year) will allow for more comfortable seating for participants. This year's conference will include 6 world class Catholic speakers: Sr. Ann Shields, Curtis Martin, Michael Dopp, George Wiegel, Patrick Madrid and Christy Dupuis, equipping us with the tools for evangelization and Catholicism in our world today.

The cost for the Summit is \$40 and includes lunch and light refreshments. Anyone wishing to attend is asked to register at the online form: <a href="www.newevangelization.ca">www.newevangelization.ca</a> drop-down to Sudbury Host Site. The Parish will reimburse you the cost for attending.

A SAFETY AND A PROTOCOL MESSAGE: Please do not use the Sanctuary as a shortcut to the Sacristy, if you need to go into the Sacristy for any purpose. The Sanctuary is a worship space, and is designed for that purpose only. It is in bad taste to use it as a shortcut. Please use the side entrance. That route is designed for safety, and for regular foot traffic, with stair nosing and a railing.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION OF A BABY: To help stop the anti-life push in the world at that time, the late Archbishop Fulton Sheen encouraged the spiritual adoption of an unborn baby. This is done by praying that one particular but unknown child's life will be spared from abortion and allowed to continue to live. To help accomplish this, it was recommended that an individual say the daily prayer for a period of nine months. If you are interested in taking on this Ministry of Life, please take home one of the blue (baby boy) or pink (baby girl) slips at the entranceway of the Church. Prayerfully consider and choose your baby's name, and then pray for him/her for the rest of this year. Fr. Michael will offer Mass on the Feast of the Holy Innocents (December 28th) for all of them, naming each one. Please keep the prayer portion of the paper so that you may offer the prayer each day, and return the portion with your child's name, via the collection basket, to Fr. Michael.





THE PARISH OFFICE: Will be closed on Thursday this week, as Fr. Michael will be travelling to North Bay for the Mass of Chrism that day. The Bishop wishes to invite everyone to the Mass of Chrism, which will take place at the Pro-Cathedral of the Assumption at 7pm.

A WORD ABOUT OLD PALMS: The palms we will use next Sunday to commemorate the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem are blessed for that purpose. So, if you really want to enter into the spirit of the day, make sure you hold your palm branch above your head and wave it during that commemoration. Once the celebration is done, however, your palm branch will quickly wither. The purpose for which it was blessed has passed, and you may simply discard the branch in your compost heap or garbage. Please do NOT return it to the Church. We have enough of a challenge staying in our 2 bag limit as it is. The analogy here is your food. You bless it (we hope!) before you eat it. However, if that food goes bad, the purpose for which you blessed it has passed, and you throw the spoiled food away. Palms are no different. If you wish to keep it for any purpose—a memory of the day, perhaps—that's fine. But there is no need to do so.

**RECEIVING HOLY EUCHARIST**: With our younger parishioners in the final stages of preparation to begin receiving the gift of Holy Eucharist each week, it might be a good time to remind ourselves of how WE receive this gift each week. Specifically, nobody 'takes' the Eucharist. It is a gift. It is received. Practically, that means the Minister of Holy Communion places the Sacrament on our hand after we respond "Amen" to the "Body of Christ". We then immediately put it into our mouth, or take one step to the side and, facing the Altar, put it into our mouth (NEVER while walking away). It is never appropriate to take the Eucharist from the hand of the Minister, unless there is a medical reason why we cannot receive it in the palm of our hand.
