RECONCILIATION—HOLY EUCHARIST—CONFIRMATION

Registration forms for Reconciliation, Holy Eucharist and Confirmation <u>are</u> <u>still available from Fr. Michael</u> for those who wish to begin their formation for these Sacraments. The deadline for their return is fast approaching.



Anyone who will be age seven or older by the end of 2018 may begin their preparation for Reconciliation/Eucharist (so, a child in grade 2 or higher).

This is a year earlier than in the past

Anyone who will be age twelve or older—usually those in Grade 7—by the end of 2018 may begin their preparation for Confirmation.

Registration forms for these Sacraments are available from Fr. Michael following any Sunday Mass—just ask him for one at the door. **They will not be available anywhere else**.

Registration forms for Reconciliation/Eucharist may be requested by the primary care giver of the child who will be preparing. Registration forms for Confirmation must be requested by the candidate who is asking to be Confirmed.

Registration forms for Confirmation must be returned no later than September 23rd.

Our first meeting will take place on Sunday, September 30th, right after Mass.

Forms for Reconciliation/Holy Communion must be returned no later than September 30th.

Our first meeting will take place on Thursday, October 4th at 6:30pm

FAITH SHARING OPPORTUNITIES: As announced last weekend, there are sign up sheets in the Church entranceway for those interested in participating in Faith Sharing Sessions this Fall. They will be held on Tuesday evenings (7-9pm) and Thursday afternoons (1:30-2:30). They will continue until Advent, at which time there will be another type of faith sharing experience offered. The following Sunday's Gospel will be the focus of each week's session.



Beginning next weekend, Communion from the Chalice will be available for those who wish to receive Communion under this form. That weekend, Fr. Michael will minister from the center of the main aisle with Communion in the form of the Host. Please form 2 lines as you currently do, and he will alternate sides when giving Communion. Those who attend Mass in Skead will be

familiar with this approach. Then, if you wish to receive the Precious Blood, there will be a minister distributing Communion from the Chalice on either side. They will say "The Blood of Christ", to which you reply "Amen". You take the Chalice from them, sip from it, and then return it to the minister. As always, we should bow before receiving. Dipping the Host into the Precious Blood is not permitted under any circumstances (we do not take this Gift, we receive it). If you don't wish to drink from the Chalice, then just walk on by.


