

Once a man and a woman enter into a valid marriage, the marriage bond is unbreakable for life. In the case of a broken relationship, one partner of the marriage may ask the Church to determine if the original marriage was, in fact, valid. This is known as the Annulment process, a legal investigation which asks the question: was the original marriage valid or not? In this Diocese, there is no

charge made to anyone for this process. It is free. This is relatively new-within the last few years. Previously, applicants were asked to cover a portion of the costs for this investigation.
