IS GOD CALLING YOU TO BE A PRIEST? "COME & SEE" DISCERNMENT WEEKEND





Friday abstinence binds all Catholics, whereby we voluntarily abstain from eating meat on Friday as a way to help remind us of the Sacrifice of Christ for us on the Cross. It is the flip side of the Sunday Feast, in which we rejoice each week in the Resurrection. In Canada, we have the option of replacing the abstinence from meat with another act or form of devotion or penance. So, if we are choosing to eat meat

on Friday, we might decide instead to pray the rosary for the intentions of the Holy Father, or make some other act of penance or piety. The point is to mark every Friday with due devotion.

Registration forms for the 2019 cycle of preparation for Holy Eucharist and Confirmation will soon be available. Watch the bulletin for details. Those who will be 7 years of age or older this year may register for the preparation needed to begin receiving Holy Eucharist. Those who will be 12 years of age or older this year may register for the preparation for Confirmation.
