With the one bag/week garbage limit beginning in October, we will embark on a renewed effort to reduce our waste, primarily by diverting as much as possible to the Blue Box and Green Bin. Please be respectful of the signs which are posted to indicate the container that should be used. Since the Church does not receive garbage pick up, whatever we produce is discarded

with Fr. Michael's pick up. Your assistance in reducing our waste is appreciated.

A REPORT ON OUR SUMMER MAINTENANCE PROJECTS: As summer winds down. so too do our various maintenance projects that we undertook these past few months. These included:

- . The professional cleaning of all the carpets in the Church,
- . The stripping, sealing and waxing of the floors in the Parish hall and kitchen,
- . The repair of a broken wire in the entranceway and the installation of a new light over our main doors.
- . The repair of the flood damage (January flood) in the Annex (Insurance claim),
- . The repair of some of the window capping,
- . The parging repair on the side of the Church
- . The filling of cracks on the lower landing of the main stairs and other maintenance work on various parts of the foundation,
- . The complete removal and rebuild of chimney (ordered by our insurance company),
- . The landscaping around our accessibility ramp *
- . The completion of our accessibility ramp **
- * We are grateful to Craig and Judy Chaperone who have worked hard all summer to beautify our front entrance and Grotto area with gardens and new paint, as well as the installation of posts and lattice. They plan on installing a new garden to the right of the stairway, now that the ramp has been completed. They also continue to complete the cement blocks in front of the new Hydrangea shrubs they planted. Those cement blocks are being recycled from their previous use around our St. John's sign.



- ** As of this printing, the handrails are in place but not yet bolted down. Once they are completed. Ivon Chaumont and other volunteers will be doing the finishing work on the top portion of our old handrails, in order to bring them up to standard and complete the project.
- . There are a number of other smaller projects that were also completed. We are enormously grateful to Harvey Quackenbush who took on much of the responsibility to ensure that all of them were done safely and efficiently. Harvey gathered the various quotes that were requested, evaluated the proposals, and recommended how we proceed. He was also present for much of the work to see it through.
- . There are still a few projects pending, one of which is the re-sealing of our parking lot/ driveway, and the re-painting of all the lines. That should be completed this month.
