A NOTE FROM FR. MICHAEL REGARDING ILLNESS



Our Bishop has encouraged Pastors to enact certain protocols as a response to the COVID-19 cornavirus that is currently spreading around the world, including our own Province of Ontario. In essence, these protocols are the same as the ones used when SARS first appeared 17 years ago.

While respecting the seriousness of any rapidly spreading infectious disease, and especially one which is new and, therefore, unpredictable at this stage, I would like to expand our concern beyond COVID-19 and repeat what is (or should be) simple, common sense advice for everyone: If you are sick, please stay home. Do not attend Mass.

Remember, the obligation to attend Mass does not apply when you are ill. There is no sin involved if you miss Mass in that circumstance. In fact, if you DO attend Church when you are sick, you may very well be "in sin" for the simple fact that you have endangered the health of others.

Remember also that there is always a level of risk in sharing Communion from the Chalice. Since there is no obligation to receive from the Chalice, if you choose to do so, you are willingly accepting the risk it entails. No, the alcohol level in the Precious Blood is likely not high enough to kill all bacteria or viruses. No, simply wiping the rim after each person drinks will likewise not remove all infectious agents. And no, God's special grace won't likely protect you from illness at that moment. He DOES give us common sense, however, and everyone is encouraged to use it.

For the time being, I won't remove the option of receiving from the Chalice in either Parish. That may change going forward. Please use your own discretion in making the decision about receiving Communion in that way.

I am the only one who distributes Communion under the Species of Bread, and I can assure you that I wash my hands thoroughly with soap and water before Mass and, as many of you are aware, I do not touch anyone until Mass is complete. I know some of you are upset when I do not shake your hands before Mass, but the only reason for that is because I love and respect all of you, and I do not want to be the one spreading germs from someone's hands to someone else's Food. To me, that's just a basic courtesy to my neighbor.

On the topic of the "Sign of Peace", it is our cultural norm to shake hands at that time. Be aware that there is no Catholic rubric that specifies how that sign is to take place, and in many cultures, it takes the form of a simple bow. You will need to decide for yourself if it's worth the risk shaking someone's hand just before you have a Communion Host placed in that same hand, which you then put in your mouth. I don't shake anyone's hand at that time, preferring instead the bow. If the person close to you chooses NOT to take your hand, please respect that. A bow of the head, a smile, a wave or a wink (be careful with that last one!) will all suffice. Again, awareness, common sense and respect should guide us.

Some infections, like the Flu and COVID-19 hit suddenly, and so we may not know we are sick until we find ourselves out in public. Understandable; but if you ARE sick, again, please stay home until you are well.

PRAYERS: Those who are preparing to enter into Weekly Communion with God through Holy Eucharist will begin their final stage of preparation over the next number of weeks. They will gather most Tuesday nights for this, and so we ask that you continue praying for them in a special way.


