A WORD FROM FR. MICHAEL

Of all the post Resurrection events recorded by the Evangelists, the one that resonates most powerfully with me is that which is recounted in Luke's Gospel, which is proclaimed around the world this Sunday. Cleopas and one other follower of Jesus are dejected following his death. Not knowing that He had Risen earlier that morning, or at least disbelieving the women who claimed to have seen a vision of Angels who spoke of His Rising, they talk about their loss of hope as they walk to Emmaus, eleven kilometres away; a two hour walk.

It is a scene so reminiscent of our own faith journey, is it not? Our hopes, our dreams, our expectations, our plans, our vision of the way the world (or at least our part of it) should unfold are so often dashed. We are faced with suffering, burdens, disappointments, roadblocks, dead ends and any number of other obstacles that leave us downhearted, walking away and unable to recognize any signs of hope in the midst of darkness. And the One Who walks with us, no matter what? He is simply, so often, a stranger who cannot possibly understand our pain.

The Stranger, however, knows our heart. He allows us to pour out our grief to Him. He listens, takes in all our pain, and then utterly transforms it into a new understanding. What a Scripture lesson that would have been! To hear God interpret the Bible - from Genesis on through the lens of Jesus, Who it all points to and in Whom it is all fulfilled. Which one of us would not have experienced our hearts burning within us as this lesson unfolded?

My dear parishioners, I share these brief words with you because I think many of us struggle to comprehend how God is in control of these times, to believe that nothing is beyond His power, and that He is raising up good from what we perceive as bad. We see the crucified Jesus, but sometimes fail to go deeper into that mystery of how God reveals to men and women of faith His love poured out for our salvation. It is the irony of God's plan that what seems to be defeat is actually the moment of victory.

That being said, I am pained by the realization that in the climax of Luke's accounting of this event, it is in the Eucharist that the Stranger is no more. Now, in the breaking of bread, they recognize Jesus present with them. And it is precisely there where my reflection stumbles and falls, because I'm unable to share that Eucharist with you. That makes my heart sad, and I'm as downcast as many of you also must be. No matter how often we practice "spiritual communion", it falls short of that intimacy to which we know God has invited us in receiving His Body and Blood.

And so, even on this third Sunday of Easter, we find ourselves still waiting for this consummation. It will come. Soon, I pray. But for now, we go forward in the confident hope that we do not walk alone, and that the One Who once was a stranger is known to us and is calling us to trust in His Presence in our daily lives. And in that trust, we also bear witness to Him, through love and mercy shown to others.




