A WORD FROM FR. MICHAEL

In all the talk of the "New Evangelization", reference is sometimes made to the source of the greatest surge of conversion to faith in Jesus Christ in the history of the world. That would be the appearance of our Blessed Mother to St. Juan Diego in 1531, on a hill called Tepeyac (now in Mexico City), in which she appeared to him as an Aztec woman – one of them – and spoke to him in his native language of Nahuatl. Her message was simple: build a Church there in her honour. The message was conveyed, however, through the miraculous image the woman left on St. Diego's tilma – the image of herself – which the Aztec people recognized instantly as conveying 4 significant meanings: protection, support, nobility and union. Within 8 years, almost 9 million Aztecs had come to faith in Jesus Christ, the God borne of this Lady who appeared to them. She had brought them a message of love that was not conveyed by the Spaniards who had conquered and destroyed, and not brought by the Christian missionaries who were unable to speak authentically to their hearts.


I mention all this in the context of the Consecration of North America to our Blessed Mother that takes place on May 1st. The Consecration has been done previously, but in today's context is being made as an appeal to our Blessed Mother to protect us during this time of pandemic. It is a simple recognition that, although we followers of Christ fall short in living authentic Christian lives, we are still united in the love of God which has made us heirs in Christ, and in which we are protected and supported in all our daily struggles. Mary is, in fact, the Empress of the Americas – from Chili to Canada. We are all under her protection. The message of Our Lady of Guadelupe for us today is that God intervenes for us, through His Mother, to lead us to Christ. She is the first disciple and the first missionary. She shows us how to evangelize: through love.

I hope you will be able to join me on Friday morning, in your own homes, in this time of Consecration. I have provided links on our Bulletin Web Page to both our Holy Father's letter for the month of May, and a link to FAQ's regarding the Consecration on May 1st. I have also placed a link on our Bulletin Web Page to the Ritual itself, for those who wish to use it.

This Sunday is also Vocation Sunday, and you will see in this bulletin our Diocesan prayer for vocations which we are all encouraged to pray. Vocation Sunday always falls on the Fourth Sunday of Easter when the Gospel speaks of the Good Shepherd. The motto of St. Peter's Seminary, where I studied, is taken from Jeremiah 3:15 **"I will give you shepherds after my own heart".** It is a reminder that those who aspire to be leaders of faith communities are called primarily to be shepherds after the heart of God. That is true of all believers. If we are Baptized into Christ, then we have a mission to lead others to Him, in the manner in which He leads: through love and service of others.

As we continue to celebrate the Risen Lord this Easter, and as we enter this month of May, we look to our Blessed Mother as a model for our lives. She humbly accepts God's will for her, and gives birth to Christ. She follows Him as a disciple, even to the cross. And she witnesses to His Resurrection and leads others to Him through a love that echoes His love. Through her prayers, may we be strengthened to do the same.




