

PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE SANCTUARY

Some parishioners have entered the Sanctuary in order to access the Sacristy, to speak to Fr. Michael or for some other reason. Please don't do this. The Sacristy is not to be entered by anyone other than Fr. Michael, and the Sanctuary should never be entered by anyone other than a minister as they perform their mandated ministry (ie. the Lector). The reason for this is to control the areas that need to be sanitized. Fr. Michael is doing all the sanitization of the Church. As soon as someone enters an area like the Sanctuary, he must sanitize a whole new zone. It really adds quite a bit of work, not to mention the damage the sanitizer does to the wood finish. Fr. Michael has cancelled all his holidays for this year, and so is present in the Parish. If you need to speak to him, please just send an e-mail or call and leave a message. He will always return your calls and answer your e-mails quickly.

DIVINE MERCY CANDLES: We have received a new supply of candles, and so they

are NOW AVAILABLE for those who wish to burn candles as both a prayer offering and as alms for the needy. Remember that 100% of your donation (\$7/candle) is given to the poor. The Parish covers the cost of the candle for you. The money first is used to support our adopted child, Veronica. After that, the money is donated to local agencies who serve the poor.



For now, if you wish to have a candle burned, please write the intention (optional) on a piece of paper and enclose it, with your donation, in an envelope marked "candle donation". You can place it in the collection basket, or leave it in the mailbox outside the Rectory entrance. Fr. Michael will light the candle for you, and will offer a Mass for your intention.

Online Summer Retreat at Villa Lovola

Theme: Who is Jesus Christ? Exploration of the 'I am' Sayings of Jesus Dates: August 17-21, 2020

Who is God? When Moses asked that question before the burning bush more than 3000 years ago, the mysterious response was "I AM". A millennium later, that strange name received a face, and that face began to teach. In the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh, left a series of statements about his identity, known as the seven "I am" sayings. Enigmatic yet meaningful, they elaborate the identity, personality, and intention of the God-with-us. Drawing from the natural world and the Old Testament, the seven images offer a rich understanding of the nature of Jesus.

I invite you to join me on Zoom for this five day retreat. Together we will explore all seven of the "I am" sayings, with a daily 9 am conference, Eucharist at 2 pm and time for sharing at 7 pm. Personal direction can be offered through Skype. Following the arc of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, the retreat will provide points for meditation, with the goal bringing about our deeper transformation in the light of Christ and into the embrace of our Creator.
