2021 Donation Envelopes

Our protocol for picking up donation envelopes is a bit different this year, in order to minimize any chance of spreading germs. Experience has shown that putting all the boxes out together leads to multiple boxes being touched by multiple people.

Your box of donation envelopes will be placed on the entranceway table in the Church IF you have either emailed or called the office, leaving a message asking for your envelopes to be left there.

In your message, please leave your name and specify the Mass you will be attending. Your envelopes will be left there for that Mass only. Please pick them up on your way into the Church.

If you are picking envelopes up for someone else, please follow the same protocol.

A WORD ABOUT CHRISTMAS MASSES



Through Advent, as we continue to prepare for our encounter with the incarnate God by heeding His call to repentance and deeper conversion, our thoughts naturally move to the celebrations marking His birth at Christmas.

Leading up to Advent, the Parish Pastoral Council deliberated about how to manage the potential increase in numbers of people wanting to attend, especially at the 5pm Mass. That Mass, in particular, has a large attendance which could, potentially this year, put us past our legal capacity during the pandemic (which is 84).

We considered the option of pre-registration. That is an option used by some of our neighbouring Churches on Sunday, and will be used by even more Parishes for Christmas. After this consideration, however, we opted to stick with the same system we have been using successfully since June: First Come – First Entry.

The doors will be open, as usual, 30 minutes before Mass begins. Once we reach either our capacity of 84 <u>**OR**</u> have filled all the available seats, nobody else will be permitted to enter. We have no choice or discretion in that matter.

Some things to consider:

- The 9pm Mass and the Christmas Day Mass are likely to have more than enough room.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Christmas Mass is suspended during the pandemic.
- Please do not plan to attend Mass at 7pm at St. Bernardine's. They will be using a pre-registration system for their own parishioners only, and will have no room for others.
- If you are sick in ANY way don't attend. That shouldn't have to be said at any time in pandemic or out. Nobody wants to catch what you have.
- If you, or a member of your household, has travelled from a Red Zone any time after December 14th, please do not attend. If there has been travel involved from other areas of the province or country, we ask you to seriously consider staying home.
- If you are health vulnerable in some way, you might also want to consider passing on the busier Masses. As the numbers increase, so too does the risk of infection.
- Christmas Day is an Octave. Given that, you might consider making one of the Christmas Masses on the weekend your main "Christmas Mass" this year. Given the suspension of the Sunday Obligation, that is a viable option.

Journey Through Advent

The season of Advent is here, this memo is to inform you of a wonderful new initiative we have begun at the Conference. Since social media are an increasingly important platform for formation and evangelization at all levels, we have produced a series of videos entitled *Journey through Advent*, which includes an introduction to the liturgical Season and reflections on the Gospel readings of each Sunday in Advent. It is the result of a joint project between the CCCB's *Office national de liturgie*, the National Liturgy Office, and the Office for Evangelization and Catechesis.

This short video series will be posted on the CCCB website and can be accessed through the rolling banner image at the top of the homepage entitled *Journey through Advent: Video Series for Advent 2020*.

WORSHIP SAFE

On June 1st, "Worship Safe" was published. It is a document containing directives concerning Catholic Church operations in the Province of Ontario. It is the document which allows us to open our doors for liturgies, albeit on a restricted basis.

The directives in that document fall into three categories: recommended, highly recommended and mandatory. As an example, the wearing of masks is mandatory. The recording of names and contact information of everyone entering the Church was considered recommended. That has changed.

On December 1st, a revised document was published. Essentially, the only change that directly impacts our parish is pertaining to that final point. It is now mandatory that everyone entering any Catholic Church for a liturgy have their name and contact information recorded. It has been a couple of weeks since we began to keep tract, and will continue to do so at all our liturgies (Sundays, Wednesdays and Funerals). The reason for this directive is to make contact tracing easier for the health authorities, should an infected person be shown to have attended Church.

Many Churches in Sudbury have been doing this all along. St. Bernardine of Siena Parish, for example, had chosen to do this from the beginning. It is a slight adjustment for us to make, and we are especially grateful to the Ministers of Hospitality who have taken on this additional task.

Going forward, we will have lists of pre-typed contact information available for Hospitality Ministers, so they need only check a box when you enter. Those lists are based on those who have attended in previous weeks, with the presumption that most attend the same Mass each week.

Based on what was observed, there is a certain bottleneck taking place in the entranceway, caused by this new protocol. It is extremely important that everyone maintain their 2 meter distancing from others. If this means having to line up outside, then please do so. Your patience and understanding could save the life of another parishioner.
