A NOTE FROM FR. MICHAEL



This weekend concludes the formal Christmas Season (informally, it continues until the Feast of the Presentation on February 2nd). Monday, January 11th marks the beginning of Ordinary Time. Of coarse, we are still quite far from what most of us would consider "ordinary time".

I am grateful to everyone who offered me prayers and expressed Christmas wishes over the past couple of weeks. Your cards still adorn the Rectory, and they remind me of the tremendous community of faith filled Christians that make up these parishes.

Looking back, it's a bit heart breaking that the two great Feasts for us Christians – Easter and Christmas – were curtailed due to the pandemic which continues to shadow us. Looking forward, we live in the hope that better times lay ahead.

Thank you for your patience and understanding during these times. All of us have had to make certain sacrifices, but I think especially of those who experienced the death of a loved one and were unable to celebrate the funeral rituals as fully as would have been normal. I think of those whose Sacramental preparations have been sidelined. I think of those who cannot gather with us on Sunday due to the health risk. I think of our many shut ins who cannot receive the Eucharist or receive the joy of visitors as before.

Although there are signs of hope ahead, we must continue to be patient. Realistically, there may be no changes in 2021 to how we currently must celebrate our liturgies. It is, perhaps, a reminder that the Christ Who is born for us today remains hidden from view, in small town Nazareth, for some 30 years before people take notice. Yet still, God is here. He is with us. Among us. For us.

SHUTDOWN EXTENSION

As is known by everyone by now, the Government of Ontario has extended by two weeks the current shutdown in Northern Ontario, and it is now scheduled to end on January 23rd (same as in Southern Ontario).

The maximum number permitted in any Church is 10, including the priest. Since there is no realistic way to organize that in a fair manner, Fr. Michael will continue to celebrate daily Mass privately, for the intentions of all parishioners.

Our current hope is that we will be able to gather once again, as a family of faith, for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time on January 23/24. We will continue to publish a weekly online bulletin in the interim.
