ASH WEDNESDAY



What is being offered this year, in every parish in the Diocese, is what is called the "Ash Wednesday Project". Every priest will celebrate the Ash Wednesday Mass on **February 17**th, blessing the ashes as we normally do. Ashes will then be placed in small containers which parishioners will be invited to pick up and bring home, so as to celebrate a form of the Ash Wednesday liturgy with

their family. Families and individuals will be free to make these liturgies as simple or as elaborate as they wish. An optional booklet will also be made available for those who prefer to follow a written outline, and a video has been posted to the Diocesan website illustrating how this home liturgy might unfold.

The hope is that many families and individuals who are unable or unwilling to attend a public liturgy, will be able to avail themselves of this important opportunity to renew themselves, through repentance, at the start of the Lenten Season. Additionally, Bishop Dowd has extended the timing of this ritual to end of February. Anyone can celebrate this ritual of repentance on any of those 12 days.

For parishioners of St. John's and St. Bernardine's, the distribution of ashes will take place in the following way:

On Ash Wednesday (February 17th), Fr. Michael will celebrate Mass privately in the morning, blessing the ashes at that time. At 9am, he will place the individual containers and the home liturgy rituals on a table just inside the door to the side entrance of the Church. If you arrive to pick up your ashes and there is someone else at the door, please do not leave your car until they return to theirs. We have 144 containers, and believe this should be enough if everyone takes just one per household. If not, we will put ashes in zip lock baggies for the rest. **The ashes will be available in this way until 6pm that day.**

For those who wish, a PUBLIC celebration of the Mass will take place in the Church at 7pm that night. Although no public announcement has yet been made, we anticipate that the pre-lock down rules will apply (30% capacity, taking of names, no singing, etc). As per the regulation issued by the Holy Father, distribution of ashes will take place by having them sprinkled on top of your head, instead of through the signing of the cross on your forehead. Please note, there will be no ashes available to take home at this Mass, unless you contact the office beforehand and indicate that you will need a container for your household.

For the following 11 days in February, ashes will continue to be available to anyone who asks. If you wish to get some, please phone or e-mail the office, leaving your name and the day on which you will pick up the ashes. On that day, they will be left for you in the mailbox at the Annex entrance.

LENT ONLINE

Lent is a time to seek to walk closer with God, particularly through the traditional means of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Spiritual reading is an excellent help in this regard, and so are inspirational and educational videos. In that vein, everyone is invited to participate in a free online Lenten presentation "Parousia: The Bible and the Mass". This teaching series is presented by the same producers of "The Bible and the Sacraments" and "The Bible and the Virgin Mary" which many of you viewed in previous seasons. (As a side note, the parish owns the DVDs of those 2 series, and anyone may borrow them – just send Fr. Michael a note with that request if you are interested).

The program begins on Ash Wednesday. Once you register, they will send you information about purchasing the booklets for the series. **You do not have to purchase these or anything else.** Just ignore that part, if you wish. They really are not necessary.

Don't skip the ashes!

If you can't make it to Mass on Ash Wednesday (February 17), take the ashes home and pray with your family!
