OUR GARDENS:

We are grateful to Craig and Judy Chaperon who continue to care for the flower gardens around our main entranceway, as well as those in the Grotto area. Plants and flowers are always signs of hope for us, living as we do in an area with such a short season for growing. That hope is reminiscent of the hope we feel as we approach the end of the pandemic that has impacted us in so many ways. Thank you, Craig and Judy, for making our property more beautiful.

STAGE TWO OF ONTARIO'S RE-OPENING PLAN:

As is known, we are now in Stage Two of Ontario's re-opening plan. That allows us to permit up to 70 people in St. John the Evangelist Church, and up to 34 in St. Bernardine of Siena Church (25% of our maximum capacity). Due to this increase, St. Bernardine's is now in a position to accept visitors from other Parishes at their Sunday Masses.



Attendance at both Parishes is on a 'first come' basis. It is still necessary to maintain 2 metre spacing, so it's possible that the Church might be "full" before the maximum number is reached.

Please also note that nothing else changes in terms of the various safety protocols that are in place, regardless of your personal situation re: vaccination. All Churches are required to follow the protocols issued by our Bishop, and those new guidelines published by the government <u>do not</u> take precedence over those our Bishop specifies for his Churches. Both he and the Pastors are ultimately responsible for the safety of everyone in our Churches, and we will err on the side of caution.

It's worth noting that, while most Covid-19 infections are now occurring in those who are not vaccinated, there are still some who are fully vaccinated who do become ill, and a few fully vaccinated Canadians who have died from Covid-19. Fully vaccinated persons might also be asymptomatic carriers of the virus; hence, the over abundance of caution until our Bishop indicates otherwise.

It's also worth noting that the dispensation from the moral obligation to attend Mass every Sunday continues. Until then, attendance is suggested only if you feel comfortable in an indoor setting with a large number of people.
