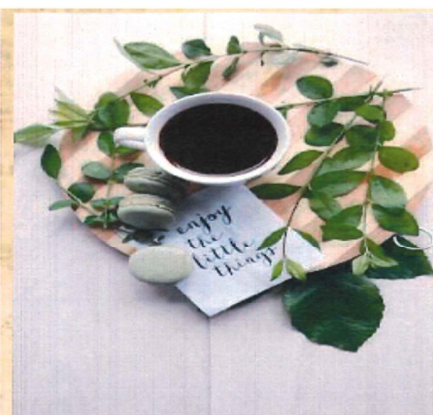

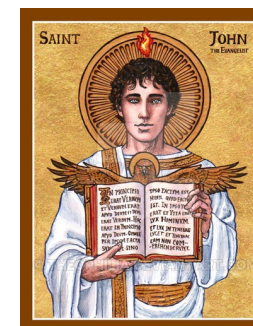

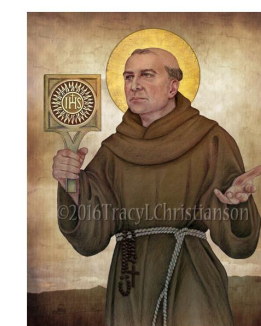

GARSON COMMUNITY FOOD BANK

SAINT JOSEPH ICON: Every few years, the Knights of Columbus selects an icon of a saint whose patronage is particularly inspiring to Knights and their communities. Each jurisdiction receives one or several of these icons which travel from council to council and serve as the centerpieces for prayer services in parishes throughout the Order. Since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979, more than 174,800 council and parish prayer services with some 22 million participants have been held. This year, an icon of St. Joseph has been chosen.

Council 6074 of the Knights of Columbus is happy and proud to have this icon of St. Joseph on display in our parish. **It will be present to us from Monday, February 14th to Sunday, February 20th.** More information will follow in the coming weeks.

Brave Joseph, collaborator in God's project for humanity, your tenderness enfolds the newborn Church. Just as Mary and Jesus recognize in you the protection of the Father, so too does the community of faith place itself under your protection. 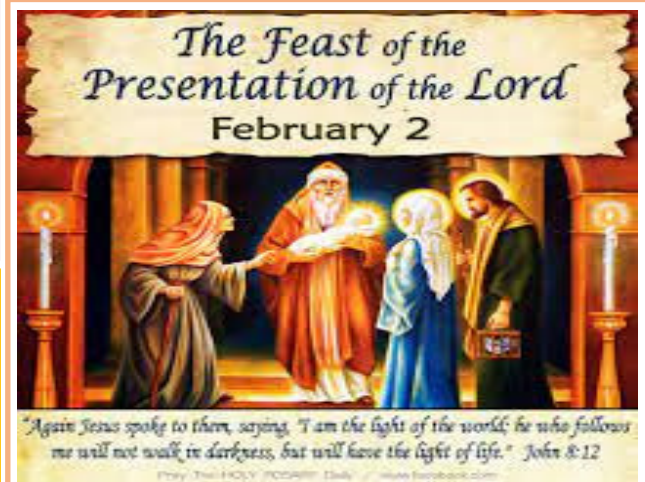
