

# COVID-19: UPDATE ON OUR SERVICES

Effective Monday, March 21st, Bishop Thomas Dowd issued a new decree for our Diocese, echoing the collective decision of the Bishops of Ontario, regarding the ongoing pandemic. The text of the decree may be viewed here: https://dioceseofsaultstemarie.org/decrees

Generally, as it will impact our Parish life, the decree stipulates the following:

✓ Masks are no longer necessary, with the exception of the Confessional Room, where the priest and penitent must continue to mask, and for the minister of Holy Eucharist when distributing Communion. Although optional, the wearing of masks is encouraged, and sensitivity should be the norm towards those who choose to wear them.

✓ Communion from the Chalice is still restricted to the priest.

✓Communion reception returns to the previous norm: there is no restriction regarding spacing, speaking within the "bubble", or consuming the Host immediately after receiving it.

 $\checkmark$ The tape on the floor will remain, as a guide for those who wish to continue spacing themselves from others. (So too the restriction to every other pew, although that will be lifted as soon as it becomes necessary: at the next funeral, or at Good Friday).

✓There is still no handshake or other physical contact during the sign of peace, except for those within the same household.

✓Funeral luncheons are now permitted; however, this service will depend on the CWL making a decision to offer it. This will be discussed at their next general meeting.

These changes reflect those issued by the Province of Ontario. They do not, however, imply the pandemic has ended, and everyone is encouraged to act accordingly. Most especially, **please do not attend Church if you are ill in any way**. That, quite simply, is an act of charity to others. Please show this love to your neighbour.

## Standing up to corporate power in Honduras



The *People and Planet First* campaign is about helping communities stand up to corporate power.

In Honduras, as in much of the Global South, corporations often threaten and criminalize activists who speak up against their abuses.

The Lenca Indigenous leader Víctor Vásquez was imprisoned for fighting the corporate takeover of his people's ancestral territory. Development and Peace's partner, the Honduran Centre for the Promotion of Community Development (CEHPRODEC), helped free him from jail.

Another partner, Caritas Choluteca, trains and accompanies community leaders in advocating for policies that respect human rights and the environment. Recently, they got mayoral election candidates to undertake to declare the municipality of Orocuina a mining-free zone if elected.
