COVID-19: UPDATE ON OUR SERVICES

COVID-19 PANDEMIC ... NEW REGULATIONS

As is well known, all pandemic restrictions, except for the masking mandate, have been lifted in Ontario as of March 1st. Effective on that date, our Bishop has also relaxed the restrictions which apply to our Liturgies.

→We are no longer required to record the name and phone number of those attending services.

→There are no capacity restrictions in place, although social distancing is still strongly encouraged, where possible.

→Congregational singing is permitted.

There are other changes which will be noticed as you attend services. Essentially, only the mask mandate remains for now, although the Communion protocol remains the same. Everyone is still encouraged to use the hand sanitizer provided, and to respect the 2 meter distancing protocol, where possible. The Sunday obligation is still suspended, and nobody should attend Church if you have any flu like symptoms, or any other viral illness.

In our two parishes, we will be easing into the reopening over time. Since our current attendance is low enough to allow it, we will keep the ribbons in place which close off every other pew. When there is a funeral, or other large attendance service, they will be removed and not replaced. The tape on the floors and on the pews will remain for now, for your guidance. The collection will still be accepted, for now, at the entranceway. Musicians and choir in Skead may resume, if they choose. In Garson, we no longer have musicians or a choir director, and so will continue with Spotify for the time being. The music, however, will transition to congregational friendly music, chosen from our hymn books.

While we are excited with this transition to full openness, we must also be careful and conscious of those who are still at risk of infection. Not everyone is comfortable with this opening, and our Bishop is encouraging us to be very respectful of them. Covid-19 is still active in Sudbury, and our hospital is still seeing high numbers of admissions.



We will be holding our General meeting on March 7th in the Parish hall at 1:30pm. All necessary safety protocols will be followed. Masks are mandatory.

It has been awhile since we have been to have one; hope to see you there.
