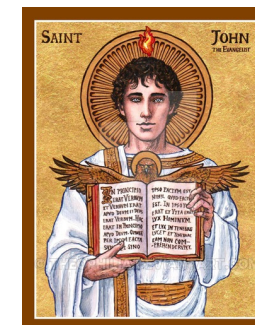

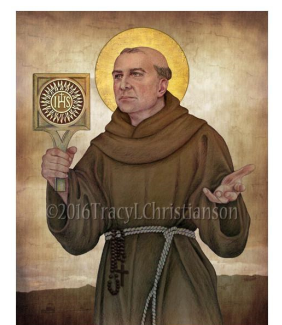

Parish Ministry Openings: Musicians and Choir Directors



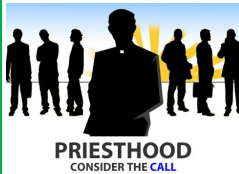
