NEW LIGHTING IN OUR CHURCHES Fluorescent lights in Canada are being phased out. As of the beginning of this year, the bulbs for them are no longer being manufactured, and they will be unavailable for purchase by the start of 2027, three years from now. In response, all of our fixtures and/or bulbs are going to be replaced with LED. This is being done by an electrical company at no charge to either of our Churches, as the cost will be covered by a rebate offered in Ontario. The same

company is retrofitting all of the Churches in our Diocese. The work on our buildings should be complete by Spring. We don't anticipate any interruptions to our services while the work is being done.
