



THIS WEEK'S MASS SCHEDULE: As noted in this week's Mass schedule, there are no weekday Masses scheduled. Fr. Michael will be on Manitoulin Island for the meeting of the priests and the Chrism Mass with the Bishop, as described just below. Thank you for your understanding.





CHRISM MASS 2024: Each year, usually during Holy Week or the week before, the priests of each Diocese gather with their Bishop to celebrate the Mass of Chrism, during which the 3 oils are blessed and consecrated by the Bishop for use by his priests throughout the Diocese for the Sacraments of Holy Anointing, Baptism and Confirmation. In our Diocese, given its size and thus the rarity of all the priests being together at once, we have traditionally combined the Chrism Mass with a general meeting between the Presbyterate of the Diocese and the Bishop.

This year, rather than gathering in one of the 3 main cities of our Diocese, the Bishop has decided to celebrate the Chrism Mass in the oldest Church in our Diocese, which is Holy Cross Church in Wikwemikong on Manitoulin Island. The meeting of priests will take place on Tuesday, March 12th and the Mass of Chrism will take place on Wednesday, March 13th (a week earlier than usual because of certain circumstances).

Due to size constraints, this Mass is open only to those invited. Each parish will send one representative, and that person will also automatically be a member of the Chrism Mass Choir. The Chrism Mass will be an all day event, preceded by a Circle Gathering in the morning and then lunch, and followed by a community feast in the evening. It is hoped that this gathering will further the efforts toward unity and reconciliation between the various cultures of our Diocese. We are grateful to our parish representatives - Sonya Arcand from St. John's and Carol-Lynn Jacobs from St. Bernardine's - for taking the time to travel and represent us at this significant event.
