ADVENT GIVING TREE: Once again this year, our Parish will sponsor the "Advent Giving Tree" to help support some of the disadvantaged members of our Garson/Falconbridge/Skead communities. Tags will be available **NEXT SUNDAY** on a tree that is to be set up in the entranceway of St. John's Church. The



tags will indicate in general terms (age and gender) who the gift is for. St. John's Catholic School in Garson is providing us the names and will distribute the gifts to those families on our behalf. If you take a tag, it must be returned UNWRAPPED to the Church no later than Sunday, December 15th. The minimum amount requested is \$7/candle, ALL of which goes to the poor (the parish donates the cost of the candle).
