* This includes all utilities, maintenance, insurance, and other such expenses that we incur on an ongoing basis in the Church and Hall. In 2025, it includes the cost of installing kneelers in the Church (\$14,067.73).

** This includes utilities, property tax, food, maintenance and other such expenses incurred in the living quarters of the priest.

*** Includes Pastor (\$32,744.16), Office Employee (\$705.53) and Custodian (\$3,296.15) plus all required benefits. The Pastor also receives Room & Board (\$11,412.12) as a taxable benefit, which is paid back to the Parish for his use of the Rectory.

This financial report is an abbreviated version of that submitted to the Diocese and to the government, as per the requirements of Revenue Canada for all Registered Charities.

Once again this year, we were able to finish with a surplus. We continue to carefully watch our expenditures, even while we ensure the ongoing maintenance of our building. For 2025, the most noticeable improvement was the installation of kneelers in the Church.

At the end of this year, we had **\$318,884.06** on deposit with the Diocese, which is available to us for future needs. Your Finance Committee is confident that our savings are substantial enough that we are able to cover any future capital costs we will face.

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We are grateful to all parishioners who contribute so generously to our Parish, and we will strive to be the best stewards possible of the resources you have entrusted to us.

The budgeting process for 2026 has been completed. There are no significant projects planned for this year. There will be some regular maintenance projects done, and we will continue to monitor our structures to ensure their safety and ongoing functioning. We are confident that, with your continued support, we will be able to afford the work we do as a Parish, while making sure our buildings are adequately maintained for the benefit of future generations.
